The entrance to the Acropolis museum (Dionysiou Areopagitou St.)



To get to the museum, take the metro outside the university (direction Elliniko). The next station is Syntagma and the one after that is Acropolis. Once there follow the signs, i.e. walk up towards the Acropolis hill and turn left. This is Dionysiou Areopagitou, a pedestrian walkway. A bit further down you'll see the entrance to the museum.

The entrance to the museum is our meeting point.

We've scheduled a guided tour for two groups (of about 50), one entering at 18.10 and the other at 18.20. The entrance fee and the guides will be paid by the conference.

After the visit to the museum you can walk down Dionysiou Areopagitou and then into Apostolou Pavlou. These are two of the central pedestrian routes to the unified network of the Athens' archaeological sites. There are plenty of cafes and restaurants in the area. If you don't feel like walking back to your hotel you can ask for the Thission or Monastiraki metro stations (depending on how far you've walked).

Alternatively, once outside the museum turn right and then left into Vyronos street and you'll be walking in Plaka (the old city) with old winding streets. Make a right on Lysikratous, and then a quick left onto Andrianou street. Adrianou is lined with shops and restaurants and it will take you back to Monastiraki square where you can take the metro back to your hotel.

Some of these central metro stations are worth seeing as they include museum-like showcases with exhibits found during the excavations and works of art by prominent artists.

Athens Happy Trains

If you want to do a bit of sightseeing in the historical centre of Athens you can take the "Athens Happy Train" (a toy-like street train) which runs every 30 mins (from 9.00 – 23.00). It departs from Ermou St. (in Syntagma Sq). The tour takes about an hour and goes through some of Athens's most famous sights and monuments including the Acropolis, the Plaka area, the Temple of Zeus, Thission, Monastiraki Square, the Ancient and the Roman Markets, the Theatre of Herodes Atticus, the Hadrian Arch and the Acropolis Museum.
